REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING Luke 22.14-23.56



This is a day both of triumph and tragedy. There is the joy of Jesus entering Jerusalem and getting an enthusiastic welcome from the crowds. "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." Words we continue to sing during the Eucharistic Prayer. But the picture very soon changes to darkness, to suffering and death.

Our key to understanding this week is in today's Second Reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians. "Let the same mind be in you which was in Christ Jesus." Though Jesus was in the form of God, he "emptied" himself, and went down to the lowest depths of degradation and humiliation, dying naked and as a convicted criminal. This is the measure of his love us, laying down his life for his friends, an expression of God's love for us. And, because of the intensity of the love he showed he is swept up into the glory of God.



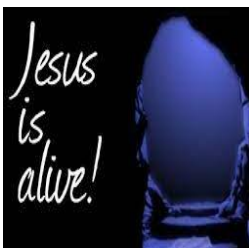

REFLECTION ON GOSPEL READING EASTER SUNDAY – John 20.1-18



Christ is risen! Alleluia! Rejoice and be glad! It is the 'first day of the week'. Mary Magdalene is the first witness of an event which marks not just the beginning of a new week but the transformation of human history. Through the resurrection of Jesus we celebrate the joy of his victory over sin and death. It is the basic tenet of the Christian faith.

The great gifts of Easter are hope and faith. Hope: which makes us have that confidence in God, in his ultimate triumph, and in his goodness and love, which nothing can shake. Faith: the belief that Christ has triumphed over evil despite appearances and that the Resurrection is the definitive act in human history. So, we celebrate the mystery of the Resurrection, proclaim our faith, and hope, and give thanks for these gifts.

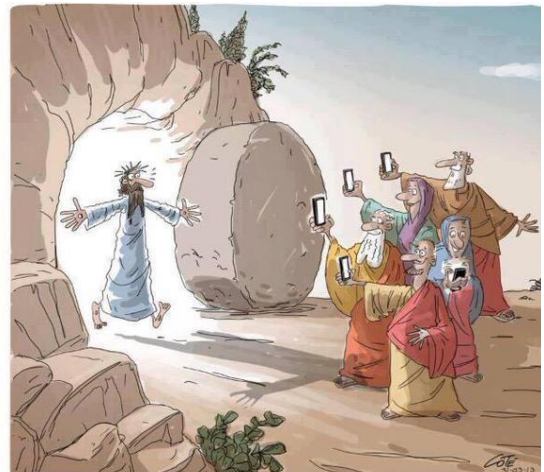
