

COVID 19 SAFETY GUIDELINES

Under current restrictions the following regulations apply to **EVERYONE** entering St Christopher's building at **ANYTIME**. Thank you for your cooperation.

- MASKS: are mandatory for all persons except for children under the age of 12, disabled people and those with exemptions. Make sure it covers your nose, mouth, and chin. Masks may only be removed for the consumption of beverages and food.
- **ATTENDANCE**: must be registered either by use of the SafeWA App or by completing the manual register provided.
- **PERSONAL HYGIENE:** Sanitise hands on entry to the building with sanitiser provided and cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or use of elbow.
- **PHYSICAL DISTANCING**: Keep at least 1.5 metres or two arms lengths from each other. Avoid queues as much as is practicable and adhere to floor markers and seating arrangements as marked.
- STAY AT HOME if unwell and if you are experiencing flu-like symptoms get tested for COVID-19. Should you test positive adhere to isolation requirements and inform Reverend Pat

REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT (LUKE 13.31~35)



Today Jesus is warned by some Pharisees to leave the area where he is teaching. The reason they give is that Herod is after him. In any case, Jesus is not moved. He knows that his life is part of a larger plan. He will do his work, including the healing of people and their liberation from evil forces. When the time is ripe, and not before, he will face his passion and death. And then

Jesus goes on to pray for the city that will be the scene of his death. It is a city that has many times in the past mistreated and killed those sent by God to bring his message. Jesus speaks tenderly of his being like a mother bird who protectively gathers her chickens under her wings. But they reject him, as they rejected many prophets before.

Let us be on the alert to recognise the Lord coming into our lives often in very unexpected ways and through very unexpected people. Some of those we reject may be bringing – even unknown to themselves – a message from God that we need to hear and follow. (www.sacredspace.ie)

REFLECTION ON GOSPEL READING THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT (LUKE 13.1 ~9)



One of the recurrent themes throughout the Lenten season is the compassion and mercy of our God. It is something that we constantly need to be reminded about. Our God is always faithful and consistent. His love for us never changes, no matter how we behave, no matter how serious our sins may be. It has to be that way because our God not only loves, he IS love. Love is of the very essence of his being; he cannot not love.

Today's readings are asking us to take a good look at ourselves. We are like that tree that Jesus speaks of in the parable in today's Gospel. It is alive but it bears no fruit. It should be cut down. The man responsible for the tree asks the owner to give it one more year. If after that, there is no fruit, it should be cut down. Every Lenten season is our chance to fertilise our tree and to see how it can be more fruitful.
