

Reflection for Pentecost 11 C - Luke 13.10-17

This healing story sums up, in a way, the whole of Jesus' message. Jesus wants us to have life in its fullness, and sets out to free us from everything that holds us captive. This means sickness, but also human attitude and judgements which imprison or constrict us. Here, it is the distorted religiosity of the synagogue leaders, who


insist that even healing needs to be regulated according to Sabbath law. Jesus attacks the absurdity of their arguments, and puts them to shame.

The Pharisees seemed always to look outwards and found fault; Jesus looked inwards and found possibility. I pray that I may be able to look on the world outside and on my own interior life as Jesus did recognising where God's Spirit is calling me to life.

Reflection for Pentecost 12C – Luke 14.1, 7~14

We live in a world that has many honour lists, where positions of importance can be sought and cherished, where the temptation to popularity has much scope. The value system that has much prominence is at variance with that of Jesus who was meek and humble of heart. This was the humility that led to his glory.

The kind of humility Jesus is talking about here was described well by a former Archbishop of Canterbury, William Temple: "Humility does not mean thinking less of yourself than of other people, nor does it mean having a low opinion of your own gifts. It means freedom from thinking about yourself at all."
