Reflection for Pentecost 7C - Luke 11.1-13



Prayer was an integral part of Jesus' life and mission. He is the teacher of prayer. His relationship with the Father was at the core of his life and ministry. His disciples asked him to teach them how to pray. And how surprised that he used such simple language!

An Australian Lutheran pastor put it like this: "Prayer is not humans taking the initiative and trying to reach up to God attempting to speak in his ear. The picture that comes to mind here is one of a small child who wants to tell his dad something really important. The dad bends down, lovingly puts his arm around the child and lets the child whisper in his ear. In this sense then prayer is not so much us reaching up to God with special words or techniques, but it is God reaching down to us." The Lord's Prayer is the model for all prayer. Reflection for Pentecost 8C - Luke 12.13-21 (



Jesus is asked to settle an inheritance case. He cautions his listeners against any kind of greed. He tells them that their lives are not made secure by what they own. They must grow into a true sense of values and recognise that their real life cannot be measured in terms of material possessions.

This is the parable for our times, where most of us seem obsessed with the idea of accumulating more and more possessions, as if the value of our life depends on how much we possess. I might not be the greedy person who is ready to trample over others to get more things, but I need to ask myself to what extent do I place my security in material things. I ask for light and for more inner freedom. As the parable says, what really matters is making ourselves rich in the sight of God. I humbly ask God to show me what that means in my case. I pray for wisdom.
