REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: Mark 6.1-13

They left the synagogue a bit enthralled. This local whom they knew as a man and boy for years, seemed very wise. Somehow his words reached them. I wonder how we might name the wisdom of Jesus. Jesus had three big statements in his teaching: God loves each of us with an infinite love; we are all brothers and sisters; and good will overcome evil. The wisdom of Jesus was not just a statement. He lived it. His way of life was sharing this love by healing, consoling, and telling his stories. People found the love of God in him. He called them and also calls us to believe with joy that all of us are brothers and sisters. Jesus treated people with love, and they knew it.

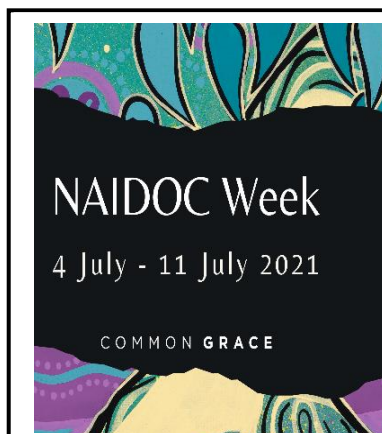

Jesus, you are the tree life. Help us to be your instruments of Truth, by the Power of your Holy Spirit.

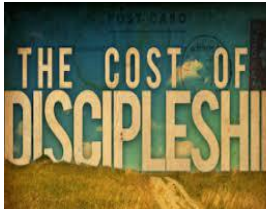
We pray for discernment and wisdom to impart your Truth. Deliver us from devastation and bring about Healing to Country and our communities.” Amen

Seventh Sunday after Pentecost (July 11) Mark 6.14-29

This is one of the most horrific scenes in the gospels. John the baptizer is the helpless and innocent one, standing for the truth. He will suffer and die because of a weak ruler, Herod. He is laid in a tomb and disappears from human history. This all points to Jesus: he is also a great prophet, innocent, but doomed to suffer and die because of

the weakness of Pontius Pilate. We are being warned not to lose faith in Jesus: he too will be laid in a tomb, but through his resurrection he will change the story of humankind. Discipleship is demanding. Like Jesus, each of us in our own way is called to serve and to give our lives for the sake of others. Lord, do not let me lose courage when things go wrong. 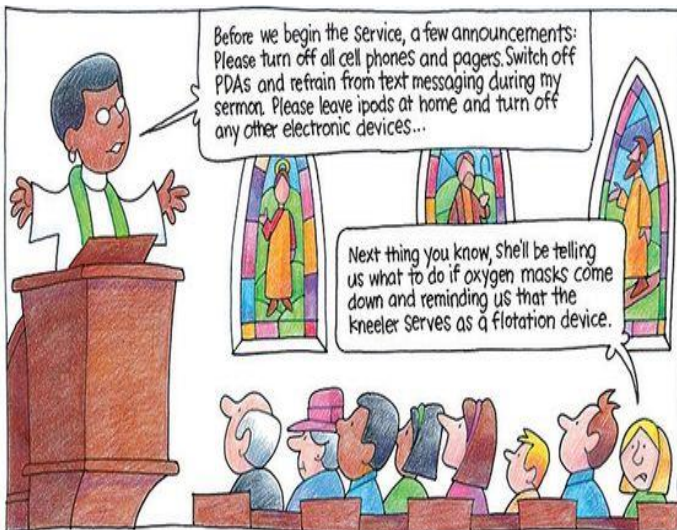
