TODAY WE CELEBRATE what is often called the birthday of the Church. Happy birthday to all! We also bring to completion our celebration of the Paschal Mystery – the suffering, death, resurrection, ascension and coming of the Spirit on Jesus' disciples.


In the first reading account from Acts the apostles are all gathered in one room at the time of the Jewish feast of Pentecost, which in the Jewish calendar traditionally falls 50 days after the Passover (or Easter in our Christian calendar). All present are filled with the Spirit. The sign of this presence is their ability to speak in different languages. A message destined for the whole world and not just for one people.

On this feast of Pentecost, as we celebrate the formation and the mission of the whole Christian community, we also need to reflect on the particular role that God has for me, to reflect on the particular contribution that I can make to the corporate mission of the Church and of the particular group with which I am involved.

REFLECTION FOR TRINITY SUNDAY: Proverbs 8.1-4, 22-31; Romans 5.1-5; John 16.12-15



Once again Jesus reminds his disciples that everything they are learning comes originally from the Father through the Son and from the Son through the Spirit. These are not three separate revelations but one message that emanates from each one successively.

For John, then, the church need not fear learning and practicing its faith in Jesus in the midst of a changing world marked by Jesus' physical absence. This is because the Spirit "will declare to you the things that are to come" (John 16:13). In other words, the Spirit makes possible a "deep understanding of what Jesus means for one's own time" without betraying the core truth of Jesus' original revelation.

We too, as church, as communities, as individuals need the constant guidance of the Spirit that we may remain faithful to the truth that is given us and be always open to understanding it more deeply so that we can pass it on to others with full integrity. www.sacredspace.ie


ANNUAL LEAVE
