Reflection for Pentecost 9 C ~ Luke 12.32-40

Once again, Jesus insists on vigilance - be prepared, do not let your attention wander so that when the master comes you are ready to welcome him. In fact we are told that the Son of Man will come at an hour we do not expect. We prefer something totally predictable, which we can control, but we know that the Lord comes to us very often unexpectedly, through events and through others. Today I pray for knowing how to be open to the presence of the Lord who comes.

When a man has had a great deal given him, a great deal will be demanded of him; when a man has had a great deal given him on trust, even more will be expected of him. I reflect in wonder and gratitude on all that I have been given, and pray for generosity in giving.

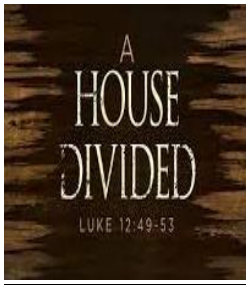

Reflection for Pentecost 10C – Luke 12.49-59

Jesus was enthusiastic about the mission given him by the Father. There was energy for it and momentum to carry it out. His desire was in harmony with that of the Father. Jesus has called us to continue that mission of bringing good news and healing. We pray for the gifts we need and for the transformation of desire that brings us more into harmony with him in living out our call.

The good news is prophetic and like all prophetic messages it gets a variety of responses. It is not that Jesus came to bring division, but his message would do so, as some would reject it. Peace was his desire, his gift to all his followers. Peace I leave you: my peace I give you (John 14:27). Lord we ask for a deeper sense of peace within our own lives, with each other and with you.
