Reflection for the Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost: Matthew



In the Gospels Jesus is asked dozens of direct and implied questions, some honest and some loaded with traps. (This has a little of both. Rabbis loved to debate which commandment was the greatest, and there were lots of different answers.) Jesus always answers people's questions with another question, or he changes the question, or he

turns it back on the seeker, or he tells a story. Except this *one time*. Here he directly, simply, literally answers the question. Love God and love your neighbour.

For Jesus every commandment is a variation on how to love God and neighbour. Nothing else matters. Jesus reiterates the old prophetic message that to love God *is* to love your neighbour. How you treat your neighbour is how you treat God. Imagine if this were our Number One Priority every moment of every day. Instead of winning the argument, might we listen? Instead of judging others might we pray? Instead of hoarding goods might we share? "What you do to the least of these you do to me." Imagine if this were how we saw our neighbours, if we actually saw our respect for them as our worship, our treatment of them as our offering, our love for people as the sum and end of our faith. www.sacredspace.ie


