Reflection from Sacred Space on today's gospel reading (Matthew 16:21-28)

Jesus was so single-minded; he knew very well what putting love as the greatest commandment and being close to the poor would mean. Yet he did not shy away from his mission; on the contrary he scolded his closest friend very fiercely, even calling him Satan. He then calls us to follow him on his way to the cross by carrying our own cross every day.

If we are to be followers of Jesus, we need to let him lead, accepting that he will not lead us away from suffering, pain or difficulty. Instead of seeking our own benefit and gain, we allow every experience – even in moments of distress – to draw us into closer relationship with Jesus who invites us to lay our burdens on his shoulders. I pray that I may let go and grow in trust of God's love for me.

CROSSLINKS

The Archbishop recently appointed Revd Pat as chaplain to Crosslinks

The Crosslinks group was founded in 1981, the International Year of the Disabled, in response to a request made to then Archbishop Peter Carnley by concerned Anglican parents of people living with an intellectual disability. The group currently consists of people with intellectual disabilities, families, friends, carers, members of the Anglican Parish of Floreat Park and other supportive people including members of the Friends of L'Arche, Perth.

The group was named Crosslinks to indicate the twin role of providing a place of meeting for worship and fellowship under the Cross of Christ and to be a crossover for people with an intellectual disability into the life of the diocese. We continue to welcome people from various denominations to Crosslinks

Crosslinks meet at St Nicholas Church Hall Floreat, at 5.30pm on the third Sunday of the month (except for December when we meet on the first Sunday) for a service of Holy Communion followed by a shared supper.

We require two volunteers from St Christopher's every month to assist with preparing and serving supper and setting down. The next Meeting is on 20 September.
