

#### REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: John 6.51-58

Today we continue our fourth reading of the 6th chapter of John's gospel. The theme is the same: Jesus as the Bread of Life. Picking up from last week, Jesus says that whoever takes the food he has to offer will live forever, a life, which begins here and now as soon as we start to partake of this special food. But today Jesus also says, "The bread that I will give is my flesh." Not surprisingly, the people around are deeply shocked at this weird-sounding statement.

What was the exact meaning of what Jesus was saying? Was he just talking about the Eucharist? It was much more than that. To eat the flesh of Jesus and to drink his blood is to be totally united with him and filled with his spirit and vision. It is to be able to say with Paul, "I live, no, it is not I, but Jesus lives in me." It means totally sharing Jesus' vision, his ideas, his values. It is to be totally identified with his mission to establish the Kingdom in this world. It is to be nourished by his Word as it comes to us through the Scriptures and have our lives directed by it. Further, because his flesh and blood are so closely related with his suffering and death, we are to identify ourselves too with that total self-giving, to carry our own cross after him and to accept the sufferings which come into our lives. ## Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost (August 22) John 6.56-69

The message of Jesus was revolutionary and challenged those who heard it. Many, including some of his disciples, chose to walk away. Peter may not understand the full import of what Jesus is saying but he knows what is essential: 'You have the words of eternal life'. Maybe Peter repeated these words often to himself.

It can be a mantra of prayer for us, as can other favourite lines from the gospels or bible. The word of God is a personal gift; each of us has our favourite lines that fill our hearts in our time of prayer as we repeat them to ourselves. The gift of Jesus is the life that underpins our human life. He has become one of us so that we become like him. His words lead us into a quality of life which gives meaning, hope and love in all we do. Nobody else can give what Jesus gives - a full meaning of life, seen in the example of his life.
