

Reflection on today's gospel reading (John 2.1-11)


John's Gospel speaks of Jesus' miracles as 'signs' because they always point to something deeper than the merely miraculous. They inform us about who Jesus really is, and about the purpose of his mission. So in the Cana story, for example, Jesus replaces the water

prescribed for Jewish purifications with more than one hundred and twenty gallons of wine! According to the Jewish Scriptures, when the Messiah comes there shall be an abundance of new wine, a symbol for God's abundant goodness towards his people. That Jesus turns so much water into the best of wines is a 'sign' that he is in fact the long-awaited Messiah. His overflowing generosity is always available to us.

REFLECTION ON THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY – LUKE 4.14~21 (23 January 2022)



In his early thirties Jesus had left Nazareth and the family workshop to listen to John the Baptist in the desert.. When John baptised him, the voice of God the Father came from heaven, "You are my son, the Beloved" (Luke 3:20). We read here of Jesus' dramatic homecoming to the little synagogue in Nazareth where he boldly identifies himself as the anointed one of God. He declares that his

mission is to proclaim the Good News of the reign of God, a God of lovie and compassion, especially for the poor and the oppressed. Lord, let us be part of that unending mission, to bring good news, vision, and freedom to those who need them.
