REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: Mark 6.30-34


This is the first encounter between the apostles and Jesus after he sends them out on mission. His fame had spread far and wide and the apostles were so busy spreading the Good News and giving witness to the glory of God that they didn't even have time even to eat. Jesus extends his compassionate love to them, directing them to find refuge in a quiet deserted place.

Jesus also invites us to come away from the busyness of our life and to go into that quiet space so that we can be with Him. It is good, indeed essential, to go apart to a 'deserted' place from time to time to rest and feed one's heart by listening for the voice of God. Prayer is a time of answering this invitation. The place of our mind can be very crowded with the cares and concerns of life. We need time to give these over to God in prayer and then time just to be still.

In today's Gospel Jesus performs the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. Jesus once said that he came so that we may have life and life in abundance, and this is so evident in this miracle: Everybody as much as they wanted, and there were twelve baskets of leftovers, much more than the amount they started with. This reminds us of the extravagant quantity of water turned into wine at Cana: We consider how God in Jesus is generous beyond our imagination, in Cana, in the multiplication of the loaves, in our own life. We ask for the grace of gratitude and pray for the courage we need to risk giving even the little that we have.
