### REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: Mark 4.35-41

Mark's Gospel challenges the disciples to grow into a more mature faith. Pitched and tossed on the raging sea, they fear shipwreck. In desperation, they wake Jesus up. He had been asleep. But they had been asleep also! They had been asleep as to who he really is. Jesus has the power of God; Jesus has the nature of God. No wonder they are filled with awe and fear of the man in front of them.

Lord, we resonate with this story. Life's storms hit unexpectedly and toss us into a sea of chaos, doubt, and anxiety. When the waves threaten to swamp us, make us aware that we have you with us. Let us hear your voice saying: 'Peace! Be still.'

Anointing and prayer for healing is available immediately after Holy Communion. Please sit in the chair next to the votive candles. Alternatively please speak to Revd. Pat.



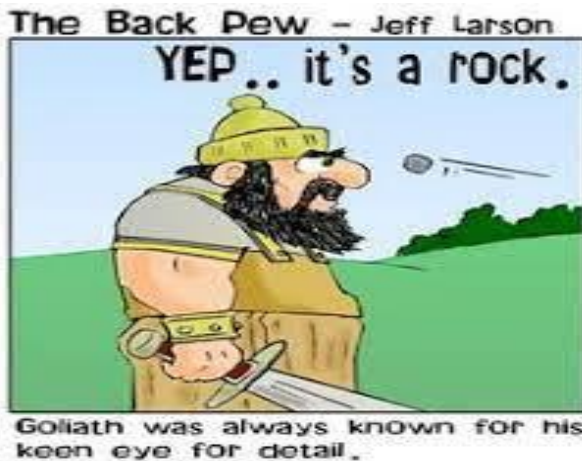
## *Fifth Sunday after Pentecost (June 27)*

Mark brings two incidents together by inserting one (woman with haemorrhage) into the narrative of the other (Jairus' daughter). Both stories are gripping and moving, dealing as they do with people in extreme circumstances. The woman has a painful, debilitating illness (apparently incurable) that isolates her from the community because it is considered as making her "impure". Jairus' daughter, by the time Jesus reaches her, is already dead. As always, Jesus shows understanding and delicacy (especially in the case of the woman). And his authority over illness and death is supreme. Note the stress that Jesus places on faith in both stories. To the woman he says: "Daughter, your faith has made you well". And to Jairus: "Do not fear, only believe". What does this say to you as you live your life as a Christian today? [www.sacredspace.ie](http://www.sacredspace.ie)
