Reflection on Today's gospel reading from Sacred Space (Mark 1.9-15)



Only a God could be so human as to endure temptation. Mark's gospel depicts Jesus as divine but also deeply human. He enters the wilderness for one purpose only: to find God, to seek God and to belong to him totally. Only then does he come into Galilee and proclaim good news.

In the bible, the 'wilderness' is a place of revelation and of intimacy with God. We need to put secondary things aside to meet God. God is found in emptiness as well as in fullness. We can find him in the emptiness of sickness and old age and disappointment and failure and solitude.

As Lent begins we might promise God that we will be faithful to the quiet space so that the kingdom of God might come near.



World Day of Prayer 2021


St. Cecelia's Church, Grantham St. Floreat. Friday 5 March 2021 at 10 am.




LENTEN STUDY GROUP
