### REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: JOHN 15.26-27; 16.4b-15

Today we celebrate Pentecost when the Spirit was given to the disciples. It is the birthday of the Church, the day when the timid and uncertain apostles were transformed into bold preachers of Jesus and his resurrection.

The regenerative power of the Spirit makes it possible for us to become children of God. With this new birth, we become a new creation, formed by the same Spirit of God which moved over the world in the opening lines of Genesis, when: "the earth was without form and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep.

The Spirit assists us, mediating God's message, helping us to recognise how our way of living conforms to what God asks of us and revealing how it does not. Lord, strengthen my ability to receive and listen to your Spirit, to remember that your Spirit speaks your word to me.

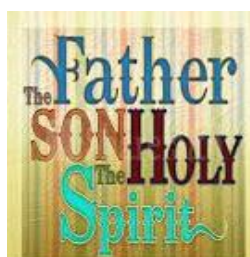

### REFLECTION FOR TRINITY SUNDAY (30 MAY 2021)



The doctrine of the Trinity is one of the most fundamental in our Christian faith, it forms part of the very earliest teaching of the church, but it is also a doctrine which many of us have difficulty coming to terms with. We often refer to it as a 'mystery.' In the New Testament, the word 'mystery' (Greek *mysterion*,) refers primarily to some truth which God has made known to us and which we otherwise would not have discovered. The Trinity, that in God there are three Persons, really is a mystery in this sense.

In our Christian lives we need to communicate and be in touch with all three Persons: Father of all our life and being, Son as Lord and Saviour, and Spirit as Guide and Teacher.

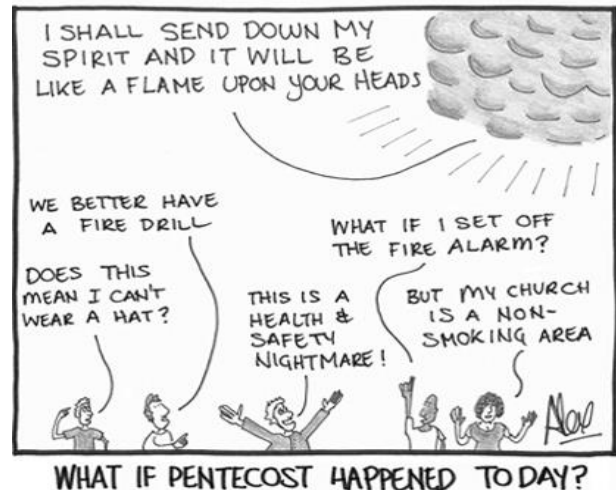
