REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: Mark 7.1-8,14-23

Very often we live by tradition, which provides continuity with the past and creates a sense of community. Yet sometimes the living tradition can be replaced by fossilised traditions which end up distracting us from what is essential in our beliefs. This is what Jesus criticised in his fellow Jews: you think you are good people by observing all the traditions about external things without caring about their spirit. This deserves the harsh judgement of Isaiah, "This people honours me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines."

Jesus proclaims a religion that is a religion of the heart. He is not interested in external things, for these cannot defile a person, but what lies in our hearts is the source of our actions. God sees the heart and its fluctuations. He judges us on the love of our lives and our efforts to love. In the evening of life God will see not just what we did, but the heart of goodness by which we lived. (www.sacredspace.ie)

Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost (September 5) Mark 7.24-37

Here is one of the great women of the gospels. She is focussed intensely on Jesus and on what she needs from him. She has concern about herself but only for her little daughter. Jesus is no match for her: she won't go away, she beats him in the argument, she breaks down his resistance. And she trusts him. Her powerful faith is immediately rewarded and her daughter is healed.

It is a story anticipating the faith of future Gentiles who will become Christians. Let us pray that that faith may be ours also. We know that Jesus excludes absolutely no one from his mercy and healing power. Both as individuals and communities, may we too be as inclusive as possible in our relationships. 

Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost (September 12) Mark 8.27-38

In today's gospel Jesus himself puts the question that has been underlying all that has gone before: "Who do people say I am?" The disciples give a number of answers reflecting the speculations of the people. Then Jesus asks his disciples what they believe. "Who do you say I am?" Peter speaks up in the name of all: "You are the Christ." Jesus reacted immediately to Peter's statement, "You are the Messiah" truth by ordering all of them to keep this to themselves. One thing that is clear from the Gospel account is that the disciples were both exhilarated and then shortly afterwards, troubled by the whole episode. To their

great dismay, Jesus began to tell them what was going to happen to Himself as Messiah. Once again it was Peter who articulated what the others were probably time him thinking. Jesus wasted no in putting in his place. There is a clear call to Peter and the other disciples that Gods ways are different. As in the words of Isaiah. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts nor are my ways your ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than yours and my thoughts your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:8-9).

A lament for Afghanistan (Anglican Diocese of Perth)

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O God, we weep over Afghanistan, over the decades of war, over the cost in lives. We weep over the waste, the destruction, the devastation.

We grieve for the dead and the displaced. Our tears flow for the shattered hopes. Our hearts confess Australia's share in the mistakes of the past and the misery of the present.

Hear, O sovereign God, as we cry out to you for the people of Afghanistan and as they cry out to you for mercy. Hear the cries of the children who have never known peace but only war.
