REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: Mark 10.17-31



Having overcome their initial shock at what Jesus had to say about the danger of wealth as a serious obstacle to being a follower of Jesus or being a member of the Kingdom, his disciples begin to take stock of their own actual situation. "What about us?" asks the ever-irrepressible Peter. "We have left everything and followed you.

Indeed, they had. At the beginning of Mark's gospel, we are told that, on Jesus' invitation, they had abandoned their whole livelihood and become followers of Jesus. It was a bold step when they really had no idea where it would lead them. Jesus reminds Peter that there is a reward for discipleship but there is also a cost. Jesus invites us to follow him just as he invited his disciples when he said to them 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' (Mark 1:17). What might that mean for me? Jesus assures us that any sign of love will be rewarded.

Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost (October 17) Mark 10.32-45



Following the same pattern as the other previous incidents, the prediction of the Passion and Resurrection is followed by a show of misunderstanding by the disciples, leading to a teaching.

Jesus now patiently gives them another lesson on what real greatness in his Kingdom consists of. In the “world” to be great is to have power over others, to exercise authority, to be able to control and manipulate people to be at your disposal, to use people to attain your ends. However, in Jesus’ world those are really great who put themselves and their unique gifts to promote the well-being of brothers and sisters, especially those in most need. 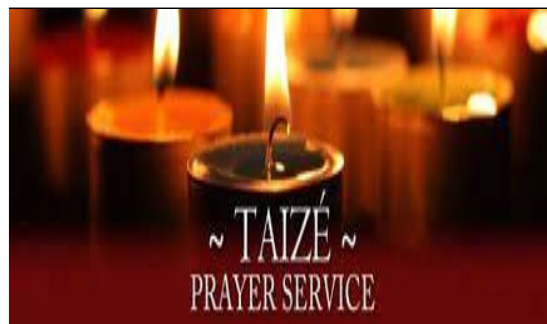
