

COVID 19 SAFETY GUIDELINES

Under current restrictions the following regulations apply to **EVERYONE** entering the building at **ANYTIME.**

MASKS: are mandatory for all persons except for children under the age of 12 and disabled people. Make sure it covers your nose, mouth, and chin. Masks may only be removed for the consumption of beverages and food.

ATTENDANCE: must be registered either by use of the SafeWA App or by completing the manual register provided.

PERSONAL HYGIENE: Sanitise hands on entry to the building with sanitiser provided and cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or use of elbow.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING: Keep at least 1.5 metres or two arms lengths from each other. Avoid queues as much as is practicable and adhere to floor markers and seating arrangements as marked.

STAY AT HOME if unwell and if you are experiencing flu-like symptoms get tested for COVID-19. Should you test positive adhere to isolation requirements and inform Reverend Pat



REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL READING (Luke 4.21~30)

Jesus' hearers were surprised at the way he spoke but they were not moved to change. After all, he was just the son of Joseph, and someone they knew so well could have nothing to say to them. But they were wrong. He makes a huge claim he has been anointed by the Spirit. He is, in other words, the Messiah himself.

Prophetic voices being rejected by their own was a common phenomenon in the past and continues to be today. This rejection was something Jesus foretold would also happen to his followers, simply for proclaiming Jesus's vision of life. His vision of life was to 'bring good news to the poor; to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind; to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.'

What is my vision for life? Where are the prophetic voices in my life and in our world today? What is their message? Am I inclined to accept it or reject it?
