#### **REFLECTION ON ALL SAINTS SUNDAY**



All Saints Sunday which we celebrate today has its roots in the early church's "Martyrs Day," attested to by a hymn written in 359 by St. Ephraim. It was called All Saints Day in the seventh century. A saint is someone who the church believes is in heaven with God. Wrongly, we often think saints are perfect, but in fact their greatest witness is how they coped with the ordinary difficulties of life and how they reflected in a variety of ways the love of God.

For most of us sanctity and martyrdom will not come in dramatic ways. The daily routine of looking after a sick child, spouse, or parent, of living with a mental, physical, emotional, or spiritual illness, the pain of being unemployed, or homeless, and the feeling that we are unlovable brings with it the reality of sharing in the lot of the martyrs and saints. May we have the grace to live a holy life that, in ordinary ways, demonstrates the extraordinary power of God working in us.


