
Reflection from Sacred Space on today's Lectionary Readings

(Isaiah 63:16-17;64:1.3-8; 1 Corinthians 1:3-9; Mark 13:24-37)

Today's lectionary readings speak of three comings of Jesus. The first coming is the one we will celebrate at Christmas, the coming of the Son of God as a human being, born of Mary in a stable at Bethlehem. It is this coming that the First Reading from Isaiah looks forward to with anticipation.

But the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem was an event in the past, a historical event. There is the coming of Jesus each and every day into our lives. This is an ongoing presence which reflects the ongoing presence of our Creator since the first moments our universe took its beginnings. He comes in every person, in every experience, in every happening. Let us not be so busy looking back at the Christmas event that we fail to be aware of his presence here and now.

The third coming, is when Jesus, at the end of time, will come to take all creation to himself. So the Gospel today reminds us of the need to be ready, to be alert, to be awake, not asleep. We keep in touch with our God through lives of prayer. We keep in touch with those around us by each day doing our best to live lives of love, of compassion, of forgiveness, of honesty and integrity. If we live constantly in this way, we will be ready for Christ whenever and however he comes.

The modern-day tradition of the Advent wreath originates in Germany. The story goes that in 1839, Johann Hinrich Wichern a pastor in Germany, built a wreath out of an old cartwheel to help the children in his mission school count the days until Christmas. He added small candles to be lit every weekday and Saturday during Advent, and on Sundays, a large white candle

was lit. German immigrants then brought the tradition with them to America in the 20th century. The evergreens used in today's wreaths represent everlasting life; holly leaves and berries represent the crown of thorns and blood; and pinecones symbolize the resurrection. The first candle represents hope, and the prophets of the Old Testament; the second candle represents faith, and Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem; the third candle signifies joy, and the shepherds; and the fourth represents peace and the angels, with their message of Peace on Earth, and good will to all men.
