In these extraordinary and challenging times when we cannot physically gather together for Sunday Worship let us unite ourselves spiritually with other Christians in solidarity and prayer.

This can be done by accessing Worship Services broadcasted on the radio, or television, as well as the use of technology, such as social media and the internet. Alternatively you are invited to pray the following prayers at the normal time you would have been attending Sunday worship at St Christopher's or at any other suitable time. These prayers can be prayed alone or with your family.

If possible, prepare a suitable prayer space. You might also wish to light a candle and have some reflective music playing in the background.

INTRODUCTION

"In truth I tell you once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I am there among them." Mt: 18:19-20

As you light the candle pray:

Lord Jesus you came as a light that shines in darkness and a light that darkness cannot overpower (Jn: 1:5) – enlighten our hearts and minds to your presence in our midst.

ACT OF CONFESSION

For the times when we have failed to love God and to love each other we ask for God's forgiveness.

God of all mercy,

we humbly admit that we need your help.

We have wandered from your way.

We have sinned in thought, word and deed,

and have failed to do what is right.

You alone can save us, Have mercy on us,

wipe out our sins and teach us to forgive others.

Bring forth in us the fruit of your Spirit

that we may live the new life to your glory.

This we ask in the name of Jesus our Saviour. Amen
